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## OUR SERVICES

In 2016 Migunani's concept paper on evaluating anti-corruption methodology was selected by the Indonesian Commission for Eradicating Corruption (KPK) and as a result, in 2017-2018, Migunani assisted KPK in evaluating their effectiveness in prevention and prosecution works. The finding of this highly sensitive and complex research was used to inform KPK's strategic planning process in 2019. Migunani is also active in the academic world. In collaboration with King's College London, Erasmus University Rotterdam and the University of Groningen, Migunani was part of a team of political-economy research on [substandard and falsified medicines in Indonesia](#).

In addition to knowledge work, Migunani provides programmatic and organizational supports that include:
